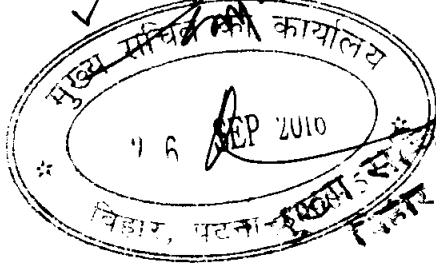

Subject: 2nd Meeting of DISHA - 3rd week of October 2016.

Dear Chief Secretary,

At the outset I would like to thank all the States for effectively organising the 1st meeting of the District Development Coordination and Monitoring Committee (DISHA) at a short notice on 13th August, 2016. The forum is a very important institutional mechanism for development coordination of the Central, State and local Governments. All flagship programmes are covered by DISHA and this improves the effectiveness of interventions.

2. You may kindly recall our letter regarding the Gram Sabha meetings on 2nd October and the suggestion regarding conducting a baseline for the Gram Panchayat based on the Panchayat Darpan. The Panchayat Darpan indicators have been effectively used in Saansad Adarsh Gram Yojana (SAGY) and they help us to track the progress on making Gram Panchayats' poverty free. The Panchayat Darpan Monitoring Framework is enclosed with this letter.

3. For a more organised and effective conduct of the DISHA Committee meeting, we have written to all Departments implementing flagship programmes to share with us 2-3 critical monitoring indicators from their programmes which could then be reviewed in the DISHA Committee meeting. Till such time as those indicators are finalised and shared, it may be useful to use to Panchayat Darpan format to understand the progress being made in a particular District.

4. Our suggestion to the States would be to use the Panchayat Darpan Framework even for the DISHA meetings to understand how programmes are doing in a particular District. If the Gram Sabha and the DISHA Committee start monitoring the same set of 36 indicators, the likelihood is that the thrust on these programmes will be more effective, leading to better outcomes.

5. Considering that Hon'ble Members of Parliament Chair or Co-Chair one or more DISHA Committees, it has been decided to hold the 2nd meeting of the DISHA Committee over the 3rd week of October and not only on the 3rd Saturday. I would also urge the States to direct Collectors/District Magistrates not only for timely organisation of the DISHA meetings but also for uploading the minutes of the meeting on the web portal well in time. This could enable a faster resolution of outstanding issues and constraints on programme implementation.

6. In the true spirit of cooperative federalism, we seek the cooperation of the States and Districts for successful Development Coordination and Monitoring through the DISHA Committees.
